



## LEARNING OUTCOMES / OBJECTIVES

Tabor College's programs are Biblically based, Christ-centred, academically sound, ministry and mission oriented, positively expressed and spiritually empowered. All courses seek to establish students in their faith and to prepare them for effective Christian life and work. Individual courses have specific learning outcomes and objectives, which are listed in the course descriptions, while common learning outcomes for courses at various levels are summarised below.

### CERTIFICATE AND DIPLOMA COURSES

The following key competencies are developed in all courses:

- Collecting, analysing and organising information;
- Communicating ideas and information;
- Planning and organising activities;
- Working with others in teams; and
- Solving problems.

The College's Certificate IV in Ministry & Theology course lays a sound Biblical foundation and is designed to help Christians grow in their knowledge and love of the Lord and to equip them for effective life and witness. The Diploma course builds on the Certificate IV course and provides additional training for various forms of Christian service, such as pastoral ministry, youth ministry, counselling and cross-cultural mission. The Certificate and Diploma courses are competency-based courses that develop an increasing level of knowledge, understanding and skills.

### ASSOCIATE DEGREE AND BACHELOR DEGREE COURSES

In addition to the course objectives summarised in the individual course descriptions, students successfully completing a bachelor degree will be able to:

- Apply concepts and principles drawn from an extensive, systematic and coherent body of knowledge, in addressing questions, topics and issues related to Christian ministry;
- Demonstrate the academic skills necessary to undertake research, comprehend and evaluate new information, concepts, theories and evidence from a range of sources in relation to traditional and contemporary issues in ministry;
- Demonstrate the ability to review, consolidate, extend and use the knowledge, understanding and academic skills developed in this course;
- Continue the process of effective lifelong study and learning;
- Demonstrate interpersonal and/or teamwork skills appropriate to employment or further study.
